Excelsior FAFSA Facts

- You must be enrolled at Excelsior College to use Federal Student Aid.
- Turn around time for processing may be as quick as 7-10 business days. However, we recommend you get your application in soon, as additional processing time may be required.
- If you are registering for May and July 2013 courses, and would like to apply for Federal Student Aid, complete and submit a **2012–2013 FAFSA** by **April 1, 2013.**
- Excelsior College's code is **014251**. You will need this for the application.
- Contact your academic advisor to receive course approval.
- Army students will need to register for courses through Excelsior's website instead of the goarmyed portal.







Step-by-Step Instruction

- **1. FAFSA.** Go to **fafsa.ed.gov**, fill out and submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid online. (If you are registering for May and July courses, be sure to fill out the 2012-2013 FAFSA.) The Excelsior College code is 014251.
- 2. Advisor Approval. Go to MyExcelsior to request course approval from your academic advisor. Once logged in, you'll be able to contact your advisor through the **My Details** page.
- 3. Study Plan. Complete and submit your Financial Aid Study Plan. Just go to MyExcelsior, on the My Details page, to create a study plan within the My Financial Matters section.
- 4. Plan Review. Financial aid counselors will review your plan and let you know within 7-10 days whether it has been approved.
 - *4a. Direct Loan Counseling. Once approved, go to studentloans.gov, navigate to "Entrance Counseling", and complete your loan counseling.
 - *4b. Sign Your Master Promissory Note. On the studentloans.gov website, navigate to "Sign Master Promissory Note", and electronically sign your promissory note.
 - *Only if borrowing Direct Loans.
- 5. Register for classes. You can do this through the MyExcelsior student course registration. Your tuition and fees will be deducted from your financial award.
